After that it was back on board for the short run to an impressive cave restaurant, carved into the soft limestone cliff-face, where we were treated to a superb three-course lunch, accompanied of course by more Touraine wines.



The afternoon was also something for the younger ones amongst us. A second mini-train took us round an impressive "parc

animalier", where deer of various types, emu, ostrich, bison and other species roamed free and came alongside to be fed. After that we could choose between a film show, a cafe or the playground until it was time for home. All-in-all a highly enjoyable and effortless day out, and a contented, sleepy ride back to Meung in good time for dinner with our host families.
